The Genesis

Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) was founded by Prof. Achyuta Samanta in 1992-93 with only 125 poor tribal students. At present, the number of students educated through KISS has touched more than 30,000, out of which nearly seven thousand have gone in for higher education at KISS. This institution has been accorded the Deemed University status by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Govt. of India on 25/08/2017. KISS has become the first University in the entire world exclusively for tribal students. The University has introduced seven new innovative areas in the first phase with the approval of UGC to provide impetus to research in tribal legal studies and tribal rights, tribal resource management, tribal culture and heritage, tribal languages, tribal medicine and tribal technology, Indic studies etc. Students get residential education free of cost.

We're a unique non-profit-cum-university that proudly provides higher education from PG to PhD, exclusively to indigenous youth, completely free of cost. As the world's only exclusively indigenous university, we are humbled to have growing worldwide name recognition, in addition to access to state-of-the-art facilities and research and teaching excellence.

We were granted 'Deemed to be University' status by the University Grants Commission, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India in 2017, and since then, there has been no looking back. Each academic year is full of achievement and growth for our KISS community. We are proud to have been recognised with a Leadership Award by the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes, in recognition of our commitment towards "Education For All". In 2019, we were also the proud recipients of "Best University in Odisha" at the first-ever Odisha Education Awards.

Our Founder

Prof. Achyuta Samanta is an educationist, philanthropist, and social worker. He is the founder of the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) and Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), both educational institutions of global repute and recognition. KIIT is one of the most prominent universities in India and the globe for professional education having more than 30,000 students from all over India and 65 other countries. KISS is a home for 70,000 indigenous children who are provided with education, boarding and skills for empowerment, all free of cost.



Besides Education and tribal upliftment, healthcare and rural development, Prof. Samanta has contributed immensely to art, culture, literature, film, media, society and national integration. It is really incredible that the child who lost his father at the age of four brought up amidst severe poverty and deprivation with seven siblings and a widow mother in a quaint village in Odisha has accomplished this monumental work without any favour or backing in such a short span of time for the society. He has converted the remote village 'Kalarabanka', Cuttack into a Smart Village and the entire Manpur Panchayat into a model Panchayat (cluster of villages).

He has been conferred with more than 50 International and National awards and over 200 state awards besides the two highest Civilian Awards from the Royal Kingdom of Bahrain and Mongolia. He has been conferred with 49 Honorary Doctorate awards from universities in India and abroad. He is the first Odia to be a member of both UGC and AICTE. He is currently the Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha) from Kandhamal, Odisha and also the President of the Volleyball Federation of India. Besides, he is the founder of Parliamentarians for Indigenous People and Designated President (India) of Democracy without Borders.

As a social reformer, he has been propagating the “Art of Giving” (philosophy of life), a concept aimed at bringing peace and happiness around the globe, Kanyakiran to promote zero-tolerance against gender-based violence, Education for all for creating awareness on the importance of Education and many more like New Mind, New Dreams, India Against Negativity, Art of Appreciation to name a few. Despite all his achievements, he leads a simple lifestyle in a two-room rented apartment as a bachelor, keeps on marching towards the cause of spreading smiles among millions and achieving zero poverty, zero hunger, and zero illiteracy.

School of Comparative Indic Studies and Tribal Science

About the School

Plants and animals have a special place in the life and living of human beings and in the case of tribals, these have emotional bonding as most of the tribals are having their inhabitations in and around natural surroundings. The knowledge, innovations and practices of indigenous peoples are manifestations of their cultures. Indigenous science incorporates traditional knowledge and indigenous perspectives, while non-indigenous scientific approaches are commonly recognized as western science and together they contribute substantially to modern science. Indigenous perspectives are holistic and founded upon interconnectedness, reciprocity and the utmost respect for nature. Several technologies have been developed by indigenous people, which substantially contributed to the development of society. Both western and indigenous science approaches and perspectives have their strengths and in recent years, science and technology have created unprecedented opportunities. Aiming the development of tribal communities and keeping the habits and habitats intact and through the application of advanced science and

technology, the School has been developed.

Along with the regular course curriculum, innovative subjects are incorporated in each semester of the PG syllabus. The syllabus is focusing on innovative subjects “Ethnomedicinal System, Tribal Livelihood, Health and Nutritional Issues in Tribal Communities, Sustainable Utilization and Management of Tribal Resources”. “Documentary theme-based movies” are also a part of the course curriculum which depicts the importance of Indigenous lifestyle, culture, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of natural resources. Equal importance has been given to gain knowledge on various techniques, instrumentation and statistics so that the students will be fit to work in any life science laboratory for research, they can also confidently work in the pharma industry or any other related area. The school offers up to date and flexible programs that will enable our students to be competitive in the job market and contribute to the holistic growth of not only indigenous communities but for the whole of mankind.

- To provide quality education and training to students for productive careers in industry, academia, and the government.
- To emphasize the education of the students to build them up to be well-informed citizens by inculcating in them critical thinking, reasoning and scientific literacy.

School of Comparative Tribal Languages and Literatures

About the School

Out of the seven schools, the School of KISS DU, School of Comparative Tribal Languages and Literatures was established from the inception of this University in the year 2017. This School offers two years Master Programmes of one hundred ten credits in the subjects such as Hindi, English, Odia and Sanskrit in addition to specialised studies from a comparativist perspective in tribal languages and literature. This School also offers M. Phil and Ph. D. the School in innovative areas of literary knowledge that is particularly concerned with tribal society, aesthetics and culture in an interdisciplinary framework. The academic programme of the School envisages preservation and revitalization of tribal literature, languages and cultures by offering a set of common innovative courses in the aforesaid Master's Programmes, namely *Tribes of India: Culture, Language, Demography, Fiction on Tribes: Issue of Land, Environment and*

Justice, Key Socio-Linguistics Concepts for Tribal Literary and Language Studies, World Poetry of the Aborigines, Multilingual Education in India for Tribals and Theme based Movies, and Study of Artefacts and Material Culture in the Museum.

Besides being trained in the critical interpretation of mainstream literary texts, each student of the School is exposed to research in ethnography, sociology and cultural anthropology through the learning of research methodology, doing fieldwork, and writing a dissertation. Career Orientation and Skill Development papers are also the unique additional features of the Master's Programmes. The chief pedagogic agenda of the School is not only to critically engage the so-called non-native, elite and indigenous cultures with the indigenous oral-literary and aesthetic traditions but also to create possibilities of cross-fertilization between them through translation.



Objectives

- To build domain knowledge in the literary streams of Odia, Sanskrit, Hindi and English.
- To enrich a comparativist critical sensibility of the students by offering them six tribal-based special literary papers in the M.A. Programmes covering knowledge of the tribal populace in India and abroad, their oral, visual and material cultures, languages, myths, religious beliefs, folklore, literary and other forms of art, socio-economic issues and problems concerning the relation of the tribes to their land, forest ecosystem, urbanization, displacement, alienation from cultural moorings etc.
- To encourage the students/scholars for the study of papers of specialization to conduct research on various tribal literary and cultural heritages in a critically nuanced manner.
- To develop the self-esteem of the tribal students about their languages and cultures together with self-reflexivity.
- To provide the facility of a multidisciplinary approach with the School of Tribal Culture, Philosophy and Eco-spiritualism, KISS Deemed to be University, Bhubaneswar.
- To understand the recent trends, areas and scope of research on Language and Literature on the Tribals.
- To enable the student to have access to emerging areas of knowledge in the concerned field and to get himself /herself equipped to participate in the state as well as national level competition to obtain a good job in Tribal Museum, Tribal Research Institutes, and any other administrative services.
- To develop competency in undertaking independent micro and macro-level research projects in the emerging areas knowledge by adopting interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research.

Outcomes

At the end of the course, the students will have a nuanced understanding of literature and culture across linguistic, racial and ethnic boundaries. They will have a comparativist framework to approach literary texts, both mainstream as well as peripheral.

School of Indigenous Knowledge Science and Technology

In the present age of globalization, the tribes who are the custodians of indigenous knowledge and technology in a real sense are far behind in the race of advancement.

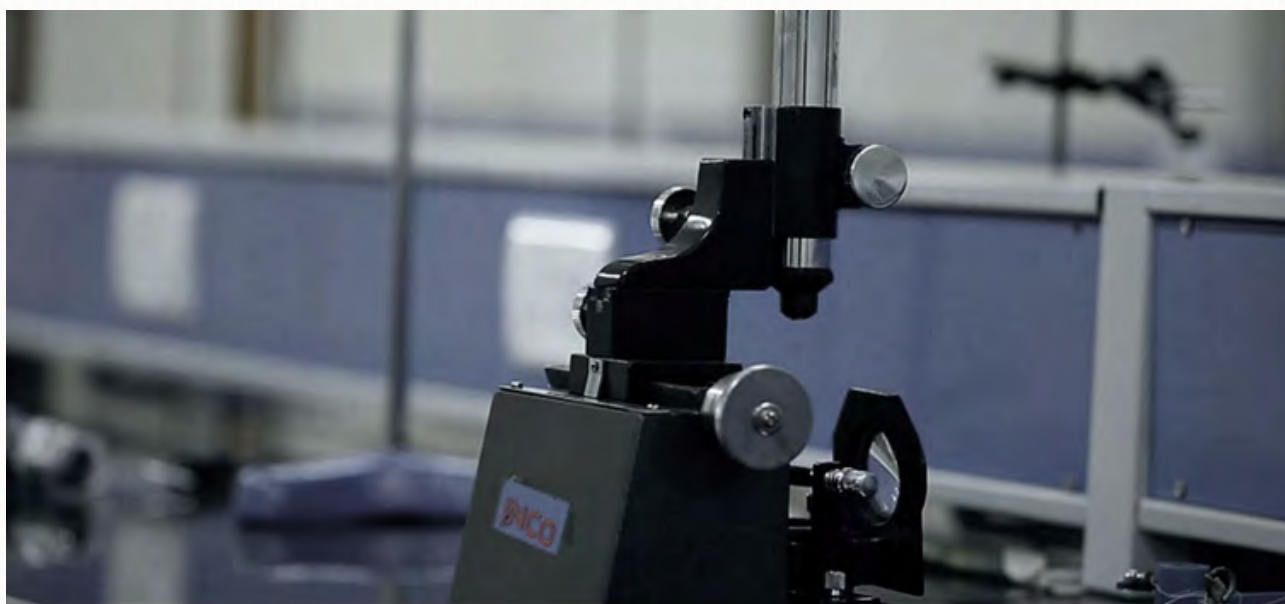
Gradual developments of such people in varied facets of life enable them to explore their traditional knowledge for human welfare. As the over-exploitation of natural resources threatens the ecological balance and sustainable livelihood of tribal people, it is imperative to study our time-tested indigenous knowledge and tribal technology with greater vigour.

Hence, an innovative School – **School of Indigenous Knowledge, Science and Technology** – has been set up to promote, preserve and protect indigenous knowledge and implement it for sustainable development.

The importance of this School is to

disseminate advanced knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in tribal medicinal systems through phytochemical analysis, geosciences and their impact on the health conditions. The importance of cosmology in their culture, Sutras and sub-sutras of Vedic mathematics, a nutritional component of the food habit of tribes, intellectual property rights to preserve and conserve the biodiversity of indigenous people and advancement in technologies relating to the natural resources of the tribal areas as well as in other branches of learning as it may deem fit.

This could be possible by teaching innovative courses in *Indigenous Knowledge and Intellectual Property Rights, Tribal Sports, Nutrition and Health Management, Indigenous People and the Science of Gemology, Indigenous People and the Science of Cosmology and Vedic Mathematics*. The courses attempt to examine indigenous knowledge and technology, blending both traditional and modern scientific methods from interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approaches.



Objectives

- To introduce the students to the concept of indigenous knowledge mainly in the field of Science and Technology in their education system in order to provide them with an opportunity for striking a balance between convention and innovation through interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary methods.
- To explore and innovate scientific knowledge through the application of indigenous knowledge by utilising the treasured indigenous knowledge of Professors of Practice.
- To collaborate with national and international universities and organizations, especially for undertaking spiritual studies and research on tribal communities.
- To offer online and offline certificate courses for enrichment and refinement of their skills and computer literacy for attaining global competency.
- To formulate tribal centric development models, publish reports and organize conferences and seminars on issues relating to indigenous science and technology.
- To create ample scope for the researchers in the field of science and technology from a tribal perspective by integrating relevant aspects of indigenous knowledge with traditional subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Computer Science.
- To make proper use of natural resources and indigenous knowledge for sustainable environmental development.
- To equip the students with knowledge in indigenous science and technology and turn them into agents of social transformation in their respective communities.
- To strive for continuous quality enhancement of academic and institutional governance to promote a culture of credibility, transparency and reliability.

Outcomes

To juxtapose as well as synthesise the established western as well as indigenous systems of scientific knowledge and work out modes of technological applications for contemporary needs and problems. Additionally, to develop entrepreneurial skills among students to achieve the objectives outlined.

The School of Tribal Culture, Philosophy and Eco-spiritualism offers two years M.A. Programmes in the subjects of History, Philosophy and Political Science with a focus on indigenous knowledge through interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary mode in its M. Phil and Ph.D. programmes. This School is interlinked with other Schools of the University in a multidisciplinary framework. It extensively deals with the history and philosophy of the tribal communities and their socio-cultural and political organizations. Six innovative tribal papers are offered by this School in its MA Programmes highlighting different aspects of tribal culture. *These papers are Tribal Culture in India: Transition and Change, World View Among the Tribals, Tribal Art of India, Tribal Movements in India with special reference to Odisha, Theme based movies/videos and Museum Visit* for the study of artefacts and material culture, and Tribal Eco-spiritualism.

In fact, these innovative papers on tribal studies also cover their livelihood patterns in contemporary situations and Indigenous knowledge on environmental issues. Students at the School of Tribal Culture, Philosophy and Eco-Spiritualism are exposed to empirical research methodology, so that they will be enabled to undertake research, write research papers and dissertations independently. The School of TCPE aims at grooming students to cope up with new and broad emerging academic environments where alternative viewpoints and innovative knowledge are appreciated and essential for action research and development. This school not only encourages the students to study and conduct research on various aspects of the rich tribal heritage but also equip them for empirical research and policymaking. The main purpose of this Innovative Department / School is to know and to preserve the rich tribal cultural heritage through proper education.

- To develop an interdisciplinary approach among the subjects like anthropology, history, tribal studies, philosophy, sociology, and political science for the benefit of the students.
- To include different curricular and extra-curricular activities for highlighting various aspects of tribal culture, philosophy and eco spiritualism of India.
- To highlight the Indigenous knowledge of the world considering the social, religious, economic, political, ecological and environmental issues of tribals in the three special papers which would also focus on their livelihood in contemporary situations.
- To encourage students/scholars for the study of tribal /special papers for conducting research on various aspects of the rich tribal culture and heritage.
- To undertake interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research in M. Phil and Ph.D. programmes for the benefit of students/scholars, this school is closely associated with the school of Tribal Heritage and Tribal Indology of our university.
- To enable the students to have access to emerging areas of knowledge in the concerned field and to get themselves equipped to participate in the state as well as national level competitions to get a good job in Tribal Museums, Tribal Research Institutes and in administrative services.

About the School

School of Tribal Heritage and Tribal Indology (STHTI) is one of the seven Schools of KISS Deemed to be University (KISS-DU) with pedagogic programmes

that embody the mission and vision of KISS-DU. STHTI envisages building KISS-DU as a premier institution of teaching, research, skill development and

social entrepreneurship for the youth from marginalized tribal communities. Accordingly, it is committed to bringing about curricular novelty and pursuing academic excellence in its three Master's Degree Programmes, namely Education, Psychology and Home Science.

STHTI does not just impart knowledge to the tribal students in the aforesaid core disciplines but also takes enough care to prevent possibilities of alienation of the students from their own culture and heritage while enabling them to participate in the

mainstream of the Indian citizenry. The curricular novelty is well reflected in the five innovative courses in Tribal Heritage and Tribal Indology comprising components like tribal art, handicraft, textile, the status of women, religious beliefs and practices. Besides, it offers Value-added courses in subjects such as Tribal Cuisines, Social Reforms through Education: ideas of Gopabandhu Das, Self-help and Happiness, and Soft Skills like Communicative English and Data Analysis. These courses also gesture towards the vision and mission of KISS-DU.



Objectives

- To develop socially competent, culturally accepted, nationally recognized, and educationally qualified human resources from tribal communities in consonance with the demands and trends of society, culture and economy in the present global order.
- To enable students to understand, explore and align the theoretical and practical dimensions of the cultural heritage of the tribal communities to the contemporary modern society, and help them critically analyse and relate the present tribal culture with both ancient and modern Indian culture.
- To empower students to undertake in-depth research studies on behaviour and attitude of the tribal people towards the prevalent formal and informal education, attachment towards their domestic businesses and their commitment towards their age-old cultural values and practices.
- To build improved pedagogic models for children and adults in non-formal modes.
- To enable students to recognize, foreground, commemorate and celebrate indigenous cultural memories of the empowering icons, events and processes.
- To train students in mental health care through self-help measures.

To not only incorporate in the study of Indology a component of tribal culture and heritage, but also help the students critically discover the cross-fertilizations of the so-called mainstream, largely westernized Indian culture, traditional Indian ethos and the ethnic tribal cultures.

School of Tribal Legal Studies and Tribal Rights

About the School

The School of Tribal Legal Studies and Tribal Rights was established in 2018, just after the KISS Deemed-to be-University declared by UGC in 2017 to conduct teaching and research on problems relating to the tribal legal studies tribal rights in the context of tribal development. The core thematic concerns of the School include questions of tribal development, tribal customary rights and problems of the scheduled tribes.

Our teaching and research programs have been conceptualized to develop systematic and comparative approaches to the analysis of tribal society, redefining the extant anthropological, sociological and social work perspectives in terms of interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary orientations.

Broadly, the vision for anthropology, sociology, and social work in India rested on a continued tradition of research based on field work through various methods. This enabled us to respond more quickly to critical tribal developments and customary rights at micro level. This plurality of theoretical and methodological approaches remains a persisting and defining feature of the School.

While setting up the Innovative School, one of the core concerns was to undertake innovative research and teaching on tribal legal studies and rights in the interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary with anthropological, sociological and social work perspectives, not conducted elsewhere.



Objectives

- To create awareness among students of legal concepts/ rules and the mechanism involved in their introduction, application and enforcement.
- To enhance students' understanding of public affairs and create an awareness of their rights and responsibilities as citizens with a particular reference to the tribal.
- To provide a brief background of the evolution of the present Indian Legal system.
- To develop an understanding of the connotations of law, its broad classification and its application in daily life.
- To develop an understanding of specific critical legal terms and concepts that will help students be better equipped to deal with day-to-day challenges.
- To enable students to understand the role and functions of legal services authority and how it serves the purpose of access to justice for all in line with Article 39 of the constitution.
- To enable students to understand the various modes of dispute resolution, their efficacy and merit over others with a special reference to the juridical process of customary tribal laws outside the formal courts and tribunals in Odisha.
- To develop communication, interpretation, reasoning and analytic skills in interpreting various tribal laws, regulations and in the study leading cases and commission reports, etc.

Outcomes

To raise legal consciousness among the tribals as to their rights to land, habitat as well as ecology and equip them with the indigenous juridical system as well as the established legal system of India.

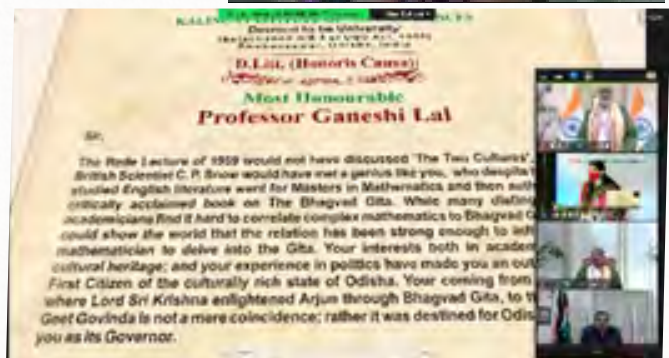
KISS-DU Holds 1st Convocation Ceremony, 143 Students Awarded Degrees Virtually

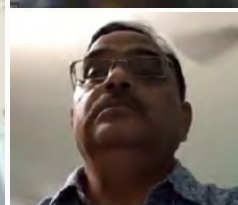
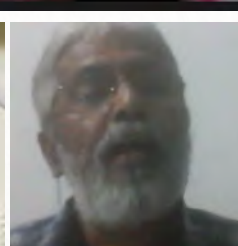
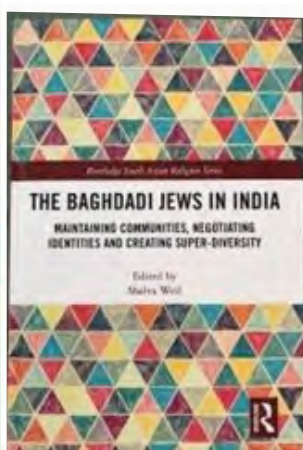
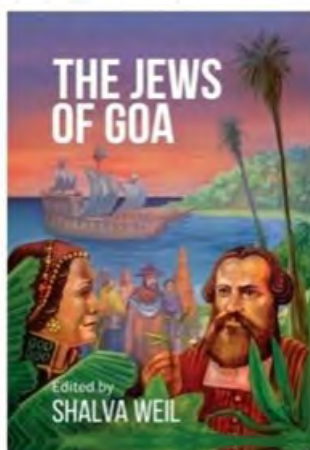
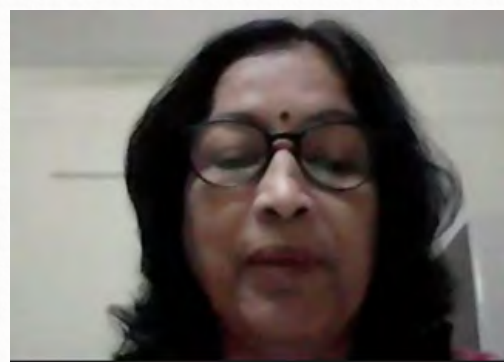
LECTURE ON: Divisions, Dispersion, and Demographics: An Ethnographic Account of Jews by KISS-DU

In his deliberation Professor E Balagurusamy posed a moot question: Why is India still called a 'developing' country?

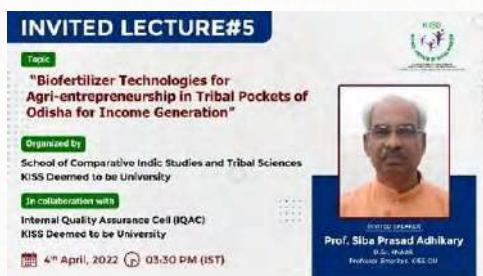

University, Tripura on 'Tribal Culture and Philosophy' in blended-mode. Professor Mohanty explained how a man is different from other creatures for his reasoning power.

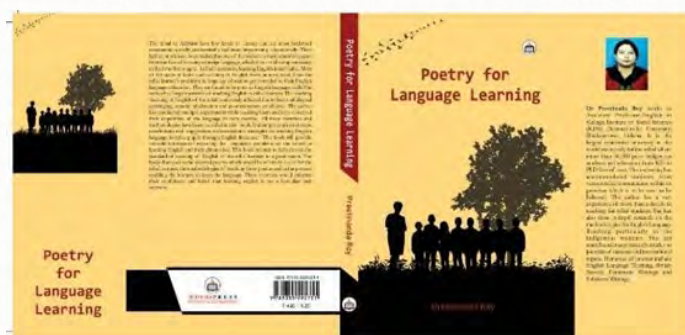
